<u>Daniel 4:35</u> — All the inhabitants of the earth are reputed as nothing: he doeth according to his <u>will</u> in the army of heaven and among the inhabitants of the earth: and none can <u>stay</u> his hand, or say unto him, what doest thou?

will - Hebrew: ts'ba - to perform in the sense of summoning ones wishes; to please.

stay - Hebrew: mecha - to strike in pieces; to arrest, hinder, or restrain

Romans 9:19 -- for who hath resisted his will James 1:18 -- of his own will begat he us-

will- Greek: boulomal - to will deliberately; to purpose.

John 1:12. 13 -- as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God -Which were born (spiritually), not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.

Daniel says no one in heaven or earth can stop Gods hand from doing his will. Paul said that there is none good, there is none willing to seek after God (Rom. 3:10-12). Man is never willing by his own will to come to God. By his sinful nature he is only willing to sin. God must cause man to be willing to say "I will". David said, "Thy people shall be willing in the day of thy power -- (Pslm 110:3). It is only of the will of God, when any man comes to Christ. God gets his will Jesus said, -- "no man can come unto me, except it were given unto him of my Father". (John 6:65) God does not save his people against their will. He causes them to be willing by his power. He is not willing that any of his people should perish (Il Peter 3:9) -- and they will not perish.
